for the 2019-2020 school year

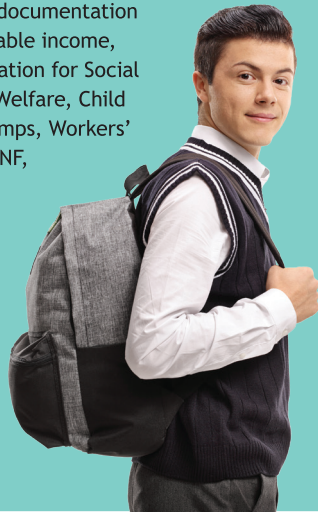
- 1 Contact the Catholic school of your choice to indicate your interest.
- 2 Complete the FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment online application at: [online.factsmtg.com/aid](http://online.factsmtg.com/aid) (Application fee required.)

Families with W2 income only will need to send their 2017 tax return along with their 2018 W2s.

Families with income other than W2 income (such as rental income, business income, income from a partnership, or any other source of income) must send their 2018 tax return and 2018 W2s.

Families who are not required to file a tax return must send documentation to reflect non-taxable income, such as documentation for Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers' Compensation, TANF, and other related documents.

Incomplete applications or missing documents will delay aid processing.

## Three forms of tuition assistance designed to ensure their success.

### PARISH SHARING

#### Your local church supporting your student



Parishes in the Diocese of Richmond support Catholic schools through an annual assessment.

- ✦ Available to children who have been baptized Roman Catholic and are registered in a Parish.
- \$ The amount of support is determined by the student's calculated need.
- ✔ These awards are available to students attending Diocesan schools.

### MCMAHON PARATER ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIPS



#### Making Catholic education more affordable for all

The McMahon Parater Endowment provides scholarships for tuition assistance to families seeking a Catholic education for their children.

- \* Both Catholic and non-Catholic students are eligible for these scholarships.
- \$ The amount of support is determined by the student's calculated need.
- ✦ These awards are available to students attending Diocesan and private Catholic schools.

### EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS TAX CREDITS PROGRAM (EISTC)



#### Significant support for eligible students

Through Virginia's EISTC program, the McMahon Parater Scholarship Foundation provides scholarships for students who are Virginia residents.

- \* Both Catholic and non-Catholic students are eligible for these scholarships.
- > Scholarships cannot exceed the state's allocation for the division in which the student resides.
- \$ To be eligible, families' annual household income must be less than 300% of the current poverty guideline (or 400% for children with disabilities).

#### Recipients must also meet one of these criteria:

- ✔ Are eligible to enter kindergarten or first grade,
- OR Attended a Virginia public school for at least half of the current or prior school year,
- OR Were not Virginia residents the preceding school year,
- OR Were prior recipients of an EISTC scholarship.

- ✦ These awards are available to students attending Diocesan and private Catholic schools.
