All Saints' integrated curriculum is based on National Standards of Learning and delivered with research-based teaching methods and differentiated instruction for every aptitude. The rigorous and relevant curriculum is designed to promote critical and higher-order thinking skills, 21st century skills application, and inquiry-based and project-based learning. All Saints' family environment allows students to improve their strengths and weaknesses so that they may realize their potential academically, socially and spiritually. Since 2006, 100% of All Saints Catholic School students have graduated from high school, and since 2010, 95% of these graduates went on to higher education. All Saints has graduated four valedictorians, including a Bill Gates Scholar.

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Curriculum Offerings

- Reading is a focal point in these crucial developmental years.
 Each lower school grade promotes word study which is phonics-based.
- · Individualized leveled reading with guided instruction.
- Our Accelerated Reader program encourages independent reading and promotes passion for reading.
- Mathematics *Investigations* promote number sense, making connections, critical thinking and problem solving.
- School-wide Peace Makers program instills gospel values and teaches our children to respect themselves, fellow students and teachers.
- Religion is taught daily with prayers, Bible stories and Biblical poems. Students attend Mass weekly.
- Weekly special programs include Spanish, Technology, Music, P.E., Art, and Library taught by teachers who specialize in these areas
- Various field trips provide context to our lessons. Our Jamestown/Williamsburg trip is a highlight for fourth graders.
 Lower grades enjoy their visits to Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens and the Swift Creek Children's Theatre.
- Grades one and two have part-time classroom aides. Students also benefit from small groups with our reading specialist and Title I teacher as needed.

S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) and Arts integration

Technology is integrated in the classrooms with SMART boards, Google Apps for Education, computer centers and one-to-one computing with Google Chrome Books (for all students grades 3–8) allowing digital interactive learning resources for all subject areas. Additionally, all grades learn proper keyboarding techniques and how to use software applications such as Google Docs, Microsoft Office, Prezi and i-Movie. Engineering design methods are applied to collaborative math and science projects. Art integration occurs regularly through project-based and design-based learning experiences coordinated between classroom teachers and our art teacher. The Spring Arts and Sciences allows students to highlight their work and learning.
