**Read Fairy Tales.** Be sure to ask who, what, when, where and why questions about the story.

Beginners' reading books including Bob Books are great for having your child sound out words.

The second paragraph should describe a situation in your life of how you have overcome a difference and how your experience compares/contrasts to that of the characters in the story.
