

Full Mission

Because All Saints keeps its tuition level low,

tuition only meets about 70% of the operating budget.

While a Parish Sharing Subsidy and other fees can help cover the "gap,"

All Saints must raise nearly \$2,000 per student in general support.

Some examples of our expenses include: technology upgrades, instructional materials, and professional teacher training.

Goal: \$100,000

Tuition Assistance

65% of All Saint's student body requires some amount of assistance to afford to attend All Saints.

This year's total need is approximately \$600,000.

All Saints meets over 80% of that need with your help!
In all, All Saints has over a dozen sources of tuition assistance from individuals, the Diocese, foundations, etc.
