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


Summer Reading Rising - 5th Grade

Book Cover

Create a new cover for your book. Be sure to include the title, summary of the book, and important characters.

Timeline

Create a timeline of events from your novel include 5 or more main events from your novel

Presentation

Create a SlideDeck or Prezi presentation of your book. Be sure to share the plot, characters, setting, and resolution

Grab Bag

Decorate a brown bag to reflect the book. Include 3 artifacts inside which must reflect the story. Include a summary of how each artifact realates to the story.

Alternate Ending

Think things should have gone differently. Creare and alternate final chapter

Collage

Use a magazine or newspaper to create a collage reflecting your book.
